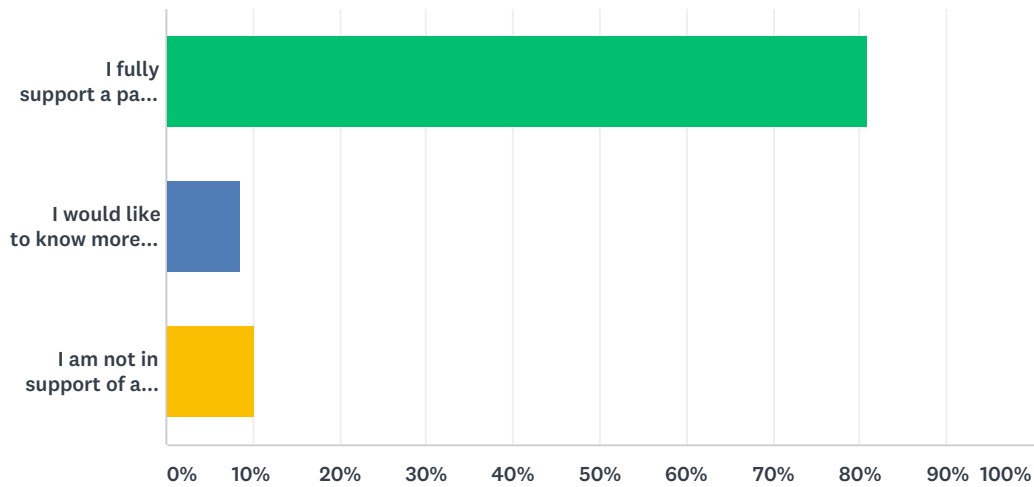


# Q1 What is your initial response to developing a community park at the Edie's Mulch Site?

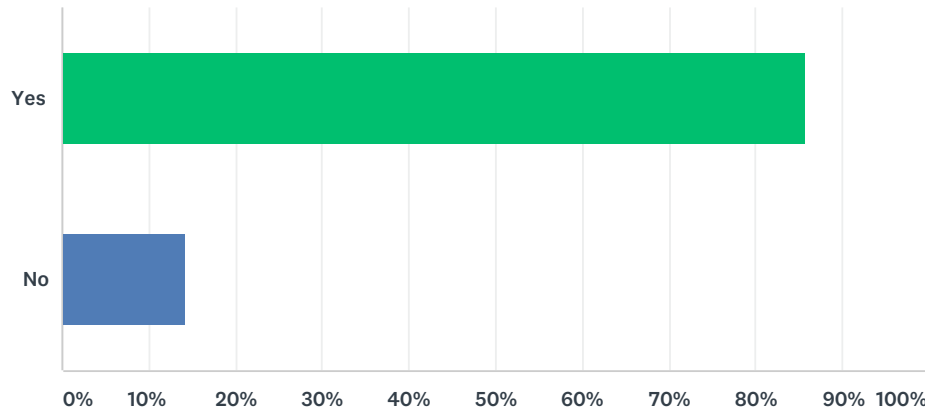

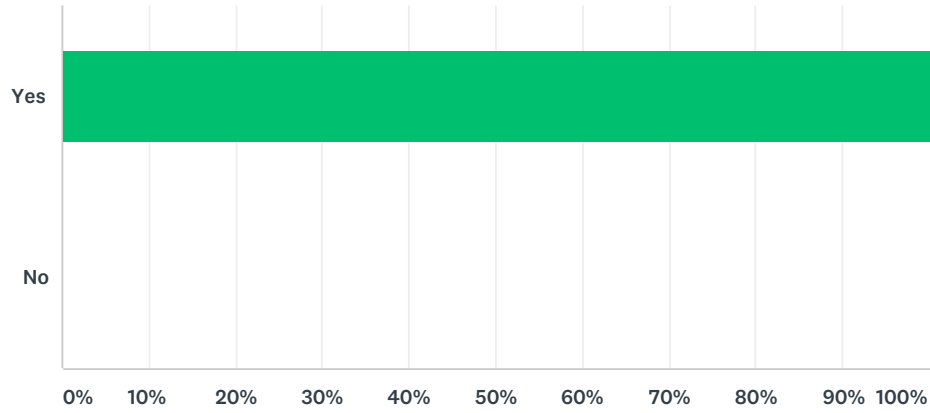
